

Par Old Cornwall Society Great War Exhibition

The Par Old Cornwall Society had a successful three days (Fri - Sun 11/13th July) at The Gott Hall with a Great War Exhibition which covered St Blazey, Par, Tywardreath and Tywardreath Highway.

On the War Memorials in these districts there are some 96 names of men who died and of those there are only two that have not been traced - F J Case, and J C Jenkins both of who are named on the Civil Parish memorial at Tywardreath and Jenkins who is also named on the Tywardreath Highway memorial.



The children of Biscovey School and Par Parish "Little Lambs" made big poppies which were displayed at the entrance (see photo) and were much admired.

There are a number of rolls of honour listing men and women who served in the Great War, but the whereabouts of the two St Blazey rolls

created by a wounded soldier whilst recuperating, covering some 150 names, one of those in the Navy, and one for the lads in the Army; the rolls used to be in the Working Men's Institute, which no longer exists - does someone know what happened to them ?
